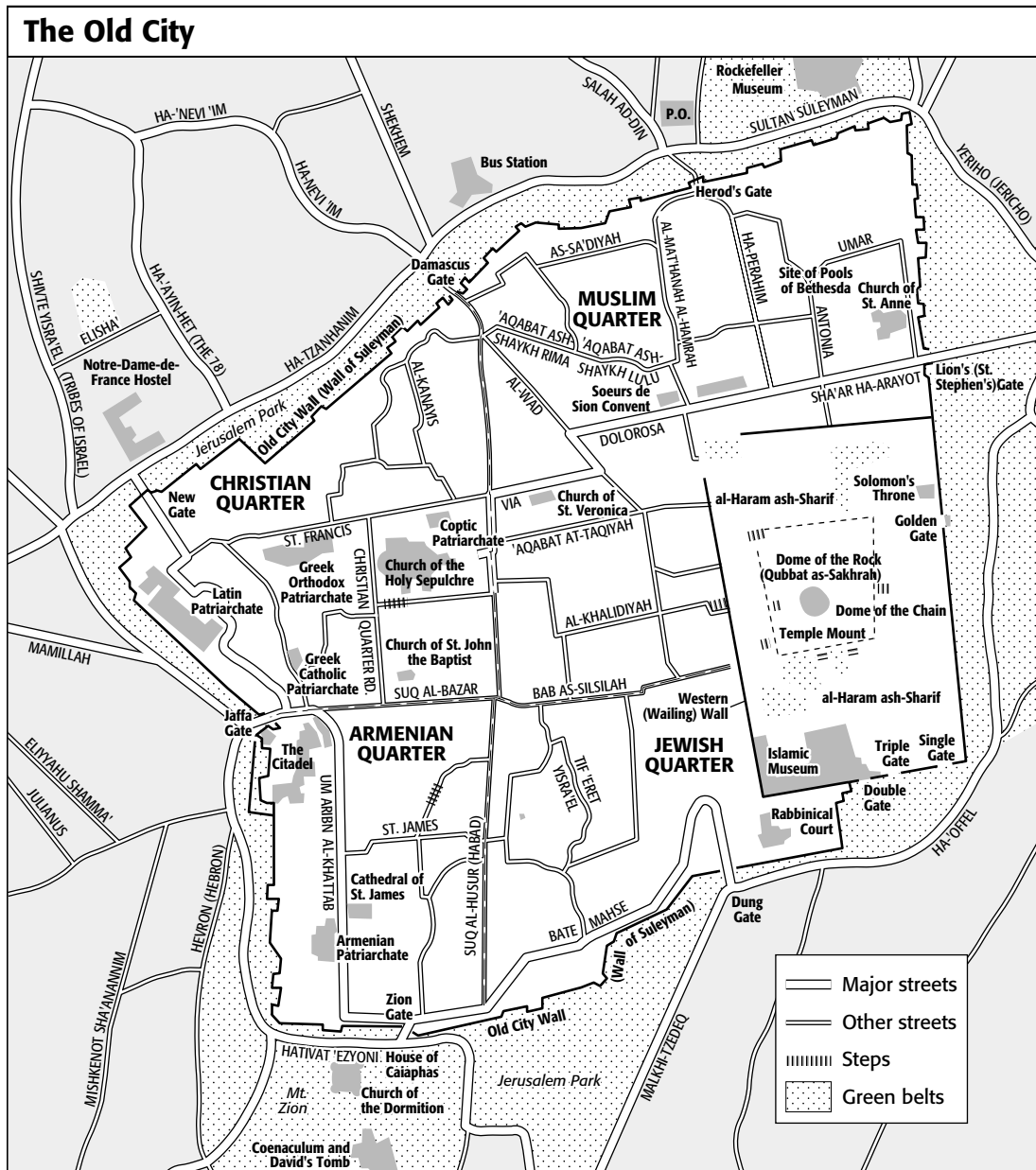


# CHAPTER 20
